## Assignments:

- 1. Write a 5 paragraph essay considering the following prompt. The essay should be well organized, double spaced, typed, and printed out with a minimum of 250 words.
  - In the action of **The Hobbit**, Bilbo changes from being a soft and timid hobbit to being a character of wisdom and courage. Several key events and incidents go towards changing and developing him. Identify at least three of these "turning points" and explore each one. For each "turning point," explain what the turning point was and how it changed Bilbo in some way, or how it marked a milestone in Bilbo's development.
- 2. A "theme" is a lesson learned or message that a story teaches the reader. It can be stated as a one sentence thematic statement that sums up the message or lesson of the story. Draw and color a picture that represents a theme in **Holes** showing creativity and effort. Somewhere on the same paper, the student should write a thematic statement that the picture is illustrating.
  - Examples: a) Instead of listing "trust" as a theme, it should be turned into a thematic statement. "A person should learn to trust himself and others."
  - b) Instead of listing "power" as a theme, it should be a thematic statement. "Power, if abused, can be harmful."
