Beloved ECS Teachers Retire


At Evangelical Christian School, we are blessed with a rich, storied history that spans five decades. We all owe a great debt of gratitude to our school's godly founders who responded to the Lord's call to provide Christian families in Memphis an excellent Christ-centered, biblically-directed education.

Many people have been a part of building upon that legacy throughout the years. Among them are **Peggy Selph**, senior kindergarten teacher who has served for 41 years; **Dee Baker**, upper school math teacher who has served 39 years; **Kathy Kallaher**, middle school English and literature teacher who has served 34 years, and **Nadia Alm**, 4th grade teacher who has served 17 years. All four of these teachers will retire from ECS, effective the end of the 2018-2019 academic year.

Former Headmaster Mickey Bowdon reflected about "Mrs. Peggy," as she was known by so many: "Hundreds of children and their parents have been blessed by the love, dedication, wisdom, discernment, and faithful guidance of this truly outstanding educator." Fond memories for Mrs. Peggy include marching in the annual Clown Parade, celebrating Lazybones Day in pajamas, and hunting for the elusive Gingerbread Man with her students.

John Roelofs describes **Dee Baker** as a "faithful friend, prayer warrior, and one who is always prepared, whether in the classroom or in coaching." In addition to teaching

math in both upper and middle schools and coaching basketball, track, softball, and cross country over the years, he has also been the sponsor of the successful Knowledge Bowl team and the Mu Alpha Theta math honor society. Coach Baker's funny sense of humor helps him connect with his students and his loyalty to them extends well past graduation.



As an ECS mom, **Kathy Kallaher** helped start the Harvest Festival, a great carnival of ECS lore, before she started teaching English and literature in upper school then middle school. She is known by others for her quick wit and her deep, abiding faith, and she is also known to be a loyal prayer warrior and trusted friend. Her love for ECS is great, and she considers her co-workers to be an extension of her family.

Nadia Alm began teaching French and working in the Advancement office at the Shelby Farms campus, then later

found her home teaching fourth grade 12 years ago. Her colleagues describe her as "a bright, innovative, life-long learner who works tirelessly to make learning a joy for her students." Her deep faith and prayer life are evident to all who know her.




FOOTBALL: Chandler
