Guidelines to Keep Us logether

The ECS COVID-19 Task Force, comprised of individuals within our community representing members of the medical, legal, risk management and cleaning and disinfecting professions, has been meeting regularly to advise our Leadership Team on implementing a back-to-school plan that balances our goal to provide the best education for your child in the safest environment possible.

- ♦ Your child's health and safety are of utmost importance to us.
- ♦ As a private school, we are not bound by the decisions of public schools or other private schools. We will consult health care professionals and consider guidelines from the Shelby County Health Department, Le Bonheur Children's Hospital, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and government officials to inform us on current trends related to COVID-19.
- ♦ Should there be a COVID-19 outbreak or need for quarantine within our community, we have developed several alternative scenarios we are prepared to enact with school-wide remote learning as the last resort.
- As always, we seek to advance the mission of the school, which is to provide the Christian family a Christ-centered, biblically directed education that challenges students to know the Lord Jesus Christ and to develop the vision and practice of excellence in academics, character, leadership and service to others.



Two Choices

We know that many of you are anxious to return to school, but we also understand that some may have a health issue or family circumstance that makes returning to school difficult. We will offer two options, and we ask you to commit to your choice for the entire first quarter. Make your selection by filling out the attached form by August 1.

1. In-Person Learning


With this option, students learn from their teachers in-person and on campus.

If a COVID-19 outbreak or quarantine situation arises, according to the Shelby County Health Department, certain exposed individuals, classes or the entire school may have to transition to remote learning.

2. Remote Learning

With this option, Middle and Upper School students will attend every class remotely by video conference just as if they were in school in person. Lower School students will follow a specific remote learning plan.

Students who choose this option will be unable to participate in team sports, extracurricular activities, or be on campus during this time.



Increased Safety Measures




Daily Temperature Checks

There will be non-contact, infrared temperature checks for all students, faculty and staff upon arrival every day.



Face Coverings

Pre-K-12th grade students will be required to wear a school-issued neck gaiter that will serve as a face covering as a part of our school dress code at this time. Students will cover their noses and mouths upon arrival and dismissal from school, during any movement throughout the school, or when physical distancing of less than 6 feet is not possible. Face coverings are encouraged but not mandatory in the classroom as desks are spaced out to achieve proper social distancing.



Social Distancing

Classroom desks will be appropriately spaced out, and students will be required to maintain social distancing unless they wear face coverings.



Foot Traffic Patterns

Hallway foot traffic will be directed to support social distancing guidelines.



Clean Hands

Students will be encouraged to wash their hands frequently, and hand sanitizer will be provided throughout campus in common areas and in classrooms.



Surface Disinfecting

High-touch surfaces will be disinfected frequently throughout the school day.



School Day Safety

We have developed a five-phase plan for this school year. For reference, Phase 1 is school as normal like last fall. Phase 2 is school with extra precautions as outlined in this plan. Phases 3 and 4 will be in-person hybrid models that will adapt to updated health and safety guidelines. Phase 5 is school-wide remote learning, which will be used as a last resort. We will begin this school year in Phase 2.

In Phase 2, social distancing will be maintained with new classroom locations and layouts, hallway traffic patterns, changes to dining and new measures for recess and physical education. Lower School and Middle School procedures will focus on classes or "pods" of students that do not cross over to other groups to reduce spread in case of any illnesses. Upper School will follow social distancing protocols. All divisions will limit large group gatherings and comply with other precautions that keep health awareness a priority.

Staggered Student Arrival/Dismissal Times at the Lower School Campus

We will conduct staggered student arrival and dismissal times in accordance with the City of Germantown, which will also help our morning carpool line as we take daily temperatures of students.

If a family has multiple children with varying arrival/dismissal times, they may arrive at the earliest time, and younger siblings will wait for their school day to begin in their classrooms. Likewise, they may also wait in their classrooms until their older siblings are dismissed for the day. Look for more information from the Lower School Principal.

The Shelby Farms campus will not have staggered arrival/dismissal times. The school day will begin and end at the same time as last year, and instructions regarding daily temperature checks for this campus will be communicated at a later time.

Lunch

For Lower School, lunch will be held in classrooms. Weather permitting, some classes may eat outside on certain days. For the Shelby Farms campus, students will eat in the class that follows lunch, and seniors will still be able to enjoy the senior privilege of eating outside, weather permitting, socially distanced. Pedestal Foods will offer safe lunch options. Look for an email with more lunch details soon.

Chapel

Because we are unable to gather large groups in one room, this year, chapel will look different. We will find creative ways to deliver the gospel message to your children even though we will not be able to all be in the same room at the same time. Middle School and Upper School Discipleship groups will continue to meet twice a week.

Before Care/After Care

For Lower School, we will still offer Before Care, beginning at 7:00 a.m., and students will be in their classrooms, socially distanced. Students will remain in their classrooms for After Care, which is offered until 6:00 p.m., and is available by reservation only. Please note that this year, there will be no After Care drop-in option at Lower School. Look for an email from the Lower School office with more information on how to sign up for After Care.

For the Shelby Farms campus, Before Care will be offered beginning at 7:15 a.m., and students must sit socially distanced in the Student Union Building until class begins. Parents who want their child in Middle School After Care, which will be a physically distanced study hall environment, must reserve their spot. Look for an email from the Middle School office with more information on how to sign up for After Care.

Special Area/Fine Arts Classes

For Lower School, all special area teachers except P.E., will come to each classroom for Music, Art, Spanish, Library and STEM. For Shelby Farms campus students, desks will be socially distanced in Fine Arts classes.

Sports

Important Parent Information

Email in Lieu of Parent Meetings

Because we are unable to gather large groups together at this time, we will send all the information you need to know before the first day of school via email this year. Email and occasional text messages are the primary means of communication from ECS. Please check your email and the ECS website regularly.

Daily Health Screening

Instead of requiring parents to fill out a health screening form for their child every day, we ask that parents sign one form, which is forthcoming, in advance of the first day of school. This form affirms that every day you send your child to school, he/she is well and not exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms.

Visitors

We will be unable to have parents or vendors in our buildings at this time.

In Case of Campus Closure or Student Quarantine

If a situation arises which requires your child's campus to transition to remote learning due to a COVID-19 outbreak or need for your child to quarantine, we ask that all parents have a plan to care for their child/children in place within 24 hours.



Orientation/First Day of School Information

Students will be oriented when they return to campus. We anticipate students will learn quickly and adjust to their new routines. We also will provide detailed materials in August for parents to better understand the new procedures.

Orientation for the Lower School Campus

Orientation for Lower School will take place on Wednesday, August 12. Parents and students will come to campus at staggered times, alphabetically according to last name, which will be outlined in a forthcoming email. Lower School students should WEAR THEIR SCHOOL UNIFORMS for traditional First Day of School photos at Orientation on WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12, when parents can be in the classrooms with their children.

Orientation/First Day of School for the Shelby Farms Campus

This year, every student in 6th-12th grades will be required to attend Orientation, which will take place on a half day on Wednesday, August 12, the first day of school. Middle School students will attend from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m., and Upper School students will attend from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. Lunch will not be served on this day.
